

Cursive I - Practice Worksheet

Trace the grey letters, copy the black ones, then write I and i on your own.

A large cursive uppercase 'I' and lowercase 'i' are shown on a three-line grid. The 'I' starts at the baseline, goes up to the midline, and then back down to the baseline. The 'i' starts at the baseline, goes up to the midline, and then back down to the baseline with a dot above it.

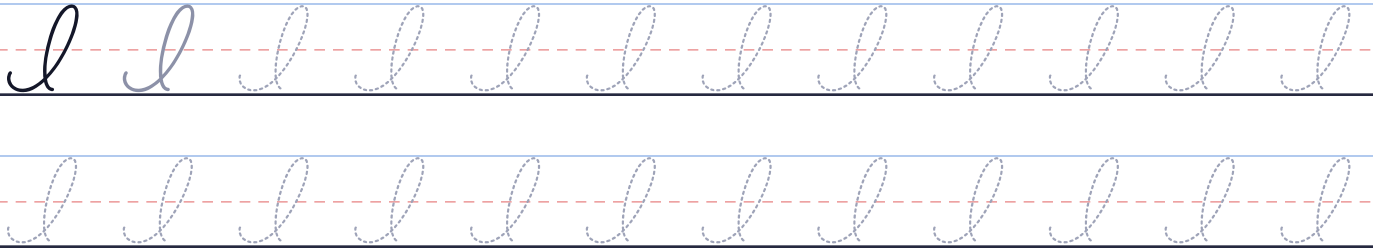
UPPERCASE I / LOWERCASE i

How to write the lowercase i

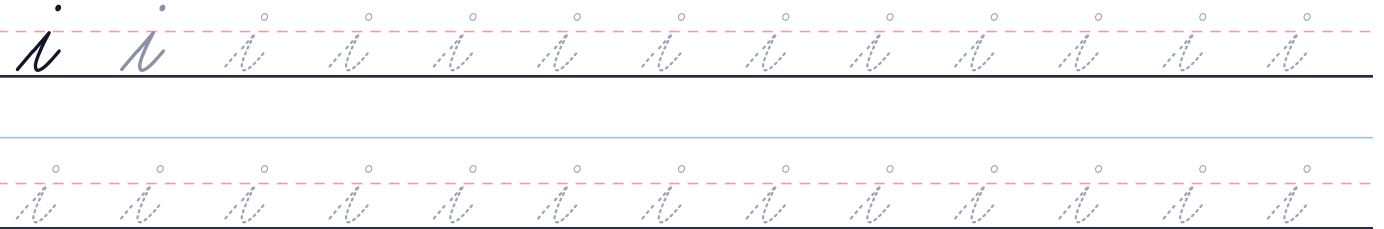
Swing up to the midline, retrace down to the baseline and exit. Dot the i after the word is written.

Tip Keep the pencil on the paper for the whole letter. Dots and crosses come after the word is finished.

1. TRACE THE UPPERCASE I

Two rows of cursive uppercase 'I' letters on a three-line grid. The first row contains 12 letters, with the first one in black and the rest in grey. The second row contains 12 grey letters for tracing.

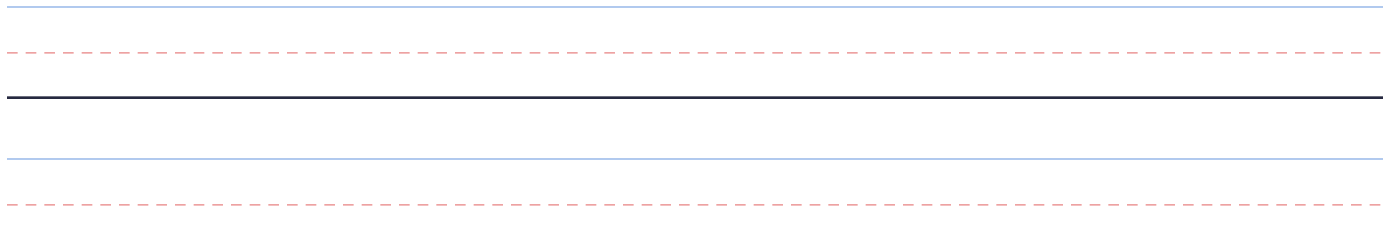
2. TRACE THE LOWERCASE i

Two rows of cursive lowercase 'i' letters on a three-line grid. The first row contains 12 letters, with the first one in black and the rest in grey. The second row contains 12 grey letters for tracing.

3. TRACE AND COPY WORDS WITH I

Two rows of words in cursive on a three-line grid. The first row contains 'in' and 'ice', each followed by a grey version for tracing. The second row contains 'idea' and 'insect', each followed by a grey version for tracing.

4. WRITE I I AND YOUR WORDS ON YOUR OWN

Four sets of blank three-line grids for independent practice of writing cursive 'I' and 'i' and words.
