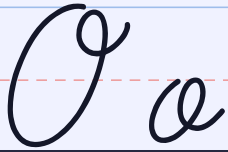


Cursive O - Practice Worksheet

Trace the grey letters, copy the black ones, then write O and o on your own.

A large cursive uppercase 'O' and a smaller cursive lowercase 'o' are shown on a three-line grid. The 'O' starts with a dot at the top, curves up and around to close the oval, and finishes with a short bridge stroke at the midline. The 'o' follows a similar pattern but is smaller, fitting between the midline and the baseline.

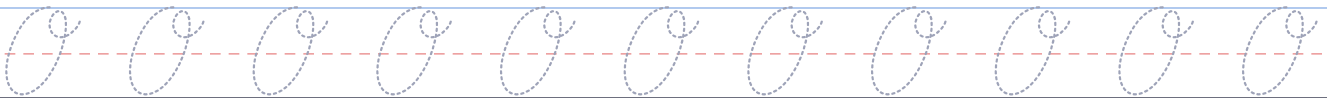
UPPERCASE O / LOWERCASE o

How to write the lowercase o

Curve up and around to close an oval, then finish with a short bridge stroke at the midline.

Tip Keep the pencil on the paper for the whole letter. Dots and crosses come after the word is finished.

1. TRACE THE UPPERCASE O

A row of cursive uppercase 'O's on a three-line grid. The first two are solid black, and the remaining ten are dashed grey for tracing.A second row of cursive uppercase 'O's on a three-line grid, all in dashed grey for tracing.

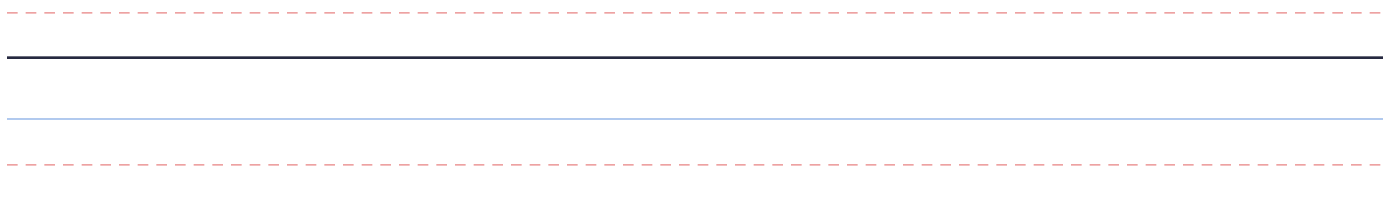
2. TRACE THE LOWERCASE O

A row of cursive lowercase 'o's on a three-line grid. The first two are solid black, and the remaining ten are dashed grey for tracing.A second row of cursive lowercase 'o's on a three-line grid, all in dashed grey for tracing.

3. TRACE AND COPY WORDS WITH O

The words 'on' and 'owl' written in cursive on a three-line grid. Each word is shown twice: first in solid black, and then in dashed grey for tracing.The words 'open' and 'ocean' written in cursive on a three-line grid. Each word is shown twice: first in solid black, and then in dashed grey for tracing.

4. WRITE O O AND YOUR WORDS ON YOUR OWN

Four sets of blank three-line grids (top blue, middle dashed red, bottom blue) for independent practice of writing cursive 'O's and words.
